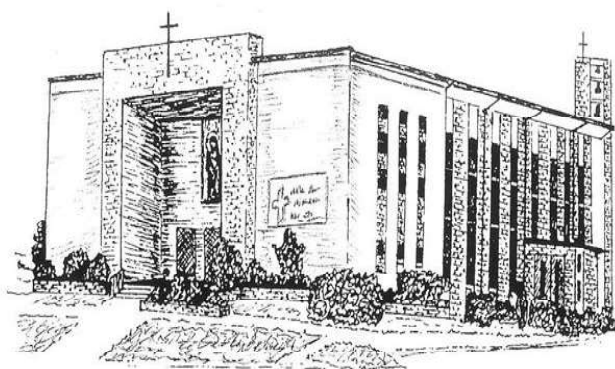

## Our Lady of Mount Carmel, The Legion Of Mary

Jesus and Mary say, *"We were so pleased to spend March's First Friday (3/1) Day of Adoration with you, listening to your prayers, comforting you and enjoying your presence, as We always do. In April, after Easter this year, we invite you to spend your First Friday (4/5) Adoration (9:15AM-5:15PM) and your Second Saturday (4/13) Holy Hour (9:30-10:30AM) with us, sharing Our Joy in the Glory of the Easter Season."*

Right now, it's **"Happy Lent!"** We're two weeks "ash-ed" and continue intent upon entering the sufferings of Jesus and His Mother, supporting them with our own prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we, members of His Mystical Body, join all our (much smaller) sufferings with His for the salvation of the World: where the Head has gone, we follow, yes?

Lent does its lighter moments! Father John (with the Knights of Columbus and Ladies Auxiliary), has made Lenten Friday abstinence from meat almost a pleasure. After the 5:30 Mass and Stations of the Cross, a fish dinner (eat in or take-out), and desserts, are offered for sale. The topper is *Leprechauns at the Loop (3/15)*, which gives us an Irish break mid-way.

But for the rest, drawing on the graces of Father Andrew Jones' Lenten Mission (2/25-26, 6:15 PM), and learning to lean on Jesus, we will be praying for ourselves and for all our brothers and sisters, growing in self-discipline, and offering generous help to the needy, the lonely, the neglected, the little ones, the sick, and the aged. In all of this we look forward to the Triduum, a single service divide in three: Holy Thursday (3/28) Mass, with the washing of feet (*"... wash one another's feet!"*), leads to Good Friday (3/29), with a reading of the Passion and prayer service ending with Holy Communion, and flows into Holy Saturday (3/30) where the Easter Vigil begun in darkness ends in a blaze of glory as we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection and welcome our new Catholics into the Church.

## LITTLE FLOWER ALTAR SOCIETY

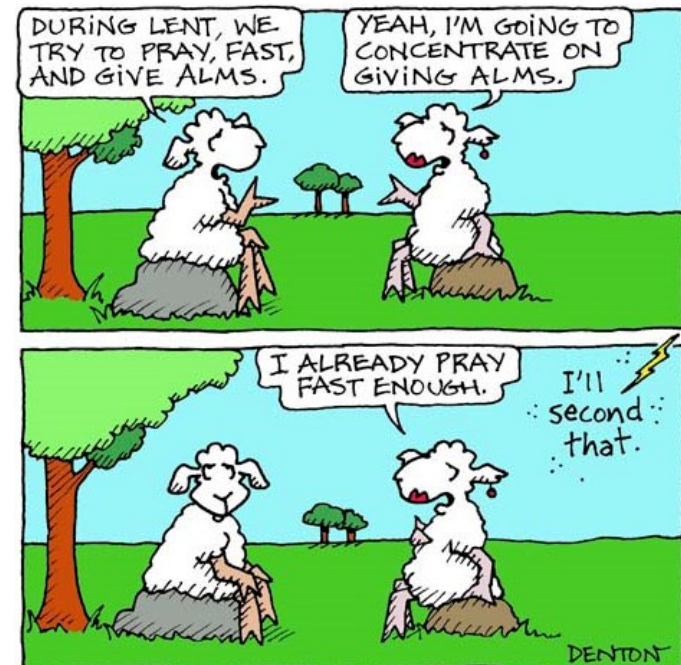
March will be a busy month at Little Flower but it seems as though they all are recently.

## The “Little Way” Calendar Little Flower 2024 Donation Calendar

We are excited to announce a new fundraiser for our Parish, the “Little Way” calendar. It is an opportunity for you to dedicate a specific day, such as a birthday, anniversary, or memorial for a loved one. **We still have dates available!!** Funds will be divided equally to support Little Flower Church and School.

Here’s how it works: each day of the year is assigned to a specific dollar amount based solely on where it falls in the calendar.

For example,

- \*January 1st is valued at \$1
- \*January 2nd is valued at \$2
- \*January 3rd is valued at \$3
- \*And so on, all the way up to December 31st, value \$365.

We ask that you pick a date and donate the amount associated with that day. This can be done in honor or memory of someone and their name will appear as follows:

- \*On the new digital billboard located on the exterior of the school gym
- \*A post on the Little Flower Catholic Church Facebook page (names published once, weekly)
- \*A reference in the Sunday Bulletin (names published once, weekly)
- \*A morning announcement and prayer at Little Flower School

As an enticement, each donor will be entered in a drawing to win a minimum of \$1,000. If the entire calendar is full, we will draw for \$5,000. For example, January 1 = 1 chance, while December 31 = 365 chances.

## *The Round Table*

We now have a couple of weeks of lent under our belts. Hopefully we have been successful in beginning our climb towards Calvary. As we continue our journey to the cross we need to be diligent so we do not fall asleep like the three Apostles in the Garden or flee when we should be standing at the foot of the Cross.

So, how? Perhaps by making use of the three pillars the Church has given us: prayer, fasting,



and almsgiving. A deeper dive into these as Lent progresses will produce real fruits from those resolutions in our spiritual life. In turn, we will be better prepared to rejoice in the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter.

We can let the pillars flow into each other. When we pray an extra Rosary, Chaplet, or Stations of the Cross, we could offer it for a friend or neighbor who needs our intercession. Praying for others is important and by praying for them we are giving of our time, which is the most important resource we have. When we fast from our favorite coffee, cookie, restaurant we eat at weekly, instead of thinking how much money we will save, we can put that money in the collection basket at Mass. Looking at ways we can give to God during Lent is one thing we will continue at the Round Table. Another focus will be on St. Joseph whose feast is this month. St. John Paul II said, "Because St. Joseph is the protector of the Church, he is the guardian of the Eucharist and the Christian family. Therefore, we must turn to St. Joseph today to ward off attacks upon the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and upon the family. We must plead with St. Joseph to guard the Eucharistic Lord and the Christian family during this time of Lent." Join us Sundays from 10:45-11:45 in the Bringer Center.
